2023 Fannin County Junior Livestock Show General Rules and Regulations

1. The show is open to all bona fide and active 4-H and/or FFA members of the current year, in Fannin County. Exhibitors cannot have participated in any other county market sales during the current school year. All entries will be shown by the owner. Any exceptions will be determined by the committee

2. OWNERSHIP and TAG-IN

All market animals must be owned by, in possession of, and under the continuous care of the exhibitor on and after tag in date.

- **Steers** will be tagged on the designated date set by AST's and CEA at the Fannin County Multipurpose Complex or will be validated in accordance with the state validation guidelines. Parents must be in attendance or submit the waiver to allow steers to be validated through the State Validation Program.
- Goats, Lambs, and Swine- will be tagged on the designated date set by AST's and CEA at the Fannin
 County Multipurpose Complex or will be validated in accordance with the state validation guidelines.
 Parents must be in attendance or submit the waiver to allow animals to be validated through the State
 Validation Program.
- Fryer Rabbits- Validation will be 6 weeks prior to show. Please ask your AST or CEA for date and time (to be held no more than 4 weeks or less than 2 weeks prior to show date)
- Broilers- Chicks provided by the Fannin County Fair will be the only ones accepted.
- Breeding Livestock- Must be owned by, in the possession of, and under the continuous care of exhibitors by September 1st.
- Replacement Heifers must be owned and in continuous care of the Exhibitor by June 30th.

- 3. All livestock rules and regulations will be interpreted and enforced by the FCJLA. An appeal of a Division Superintendent's decision may be made to the Livestock Superintendent by submitting a \$200.00 cash deposit for the appeal fee. The appeal must be written, plainly stating the reason for the appeal. The written appeal and cash deposit must be delivered to the Livestock Superintendent within 1 hour from the conclusion of the show division to be appealed. Decision of the Livestock Superintendent is final. Appeals not upheld by the Livestock Superintendent will forfeit the appeal fee of \$200.00. Judges' decisions are not subject to appeal.
- 4. Violation of any rule of the Fannin County Fair can result in exhibitors being disqualified for the current and following year. Violators are subject to dismissal from the fairgrounds and the forfeiture of prize and sale money.
- 5. Judge's decision will be final. Any exhibitors showing disrespect for the judge will be promptly disqualified.
- 6. Only exhibitors and authorized personnel will be allowed in the show and sale rings during the showing and selling of projects.
- 7. The rules of the Animal Health Commission apply. No health papers will be required. However, animals demonstrating signs of sickness shall be removed from the grounds immediately by the exhibitor upon decision of the overseeing superintendent. After the livestock show is over, all placing will be final. If a market animal becomes ill between the show and the market sale, the exhibitor will be allowed to bring a substitute animal through the sale ring.
- 8. Aisles and alleys are to be kept neat, clean and open to the public always.
- 9. Exhibitors will be required to furnish, feed, and care for their animals during the show. To avoid messes, exhibitors are not to leave unattended water in swine pens.
- 10. Tie spaces and pens will be assigned by the Division Superintendent.
- 11. **NIGHT CURFEW:** Lights will be turned off at 11:00 pm each night. Only designated security personnel will be allowed to stay past that time. This will be strictly enforced.

13. A Premium Sale will be held on Saturday evening. Sale order of each species/division will begin with Grand and Reserve Champion, followed by determination by the judge in each species. Each species/division will determine a set number of alternates after all predetermined numbers have been met. The exhibitor has the option to decline entry in the sale. Decision will be made at the time of selection of the sale order for that species/divison. Each exhibitor can have up to two different projects in the sale, as long as they are not of the same species. If the exhibitor has more than two projects to qualify, they may choose which two projects they put in the sale.

- 14. Arrival- All livestock will enter from FM 87 entrance on respected days per each specie.
- **15. Showmanship** will consist of two age divisions. Junior (3rd to 8th grades) and Senior (9th to 12th grades) in school. Showmanship is open to all eligible exhibitors and will be at the beginning of each show. Exhibitors must have entered an animal in that species and show their own animal.

16. Awards will be:

- Belt Buckle to Division Champions
- Belt Buckle to Division Reserve Champions
- Ribbons through top 5 places in each class
- **17.** No exhibitor may advertise from stall areas.
- **18.** Exhibitors may use any normally accepted ethical fitting product (spray, oil, sheen, etc.). No changing of the animal's major color pattern, no false hair, foreign leg building material, or glue will be permitted. Exhibitors are encouraged to do their major clipping before arrival, however, touch up

clipping will be allowed on the grounds. Due to power supply limitations, generators are encouraged. **Division rules may supersede this rule.**

- **19.** All unruly animals will be removed from the ring at the judge's discretion.
- **20.** All entries must be signed and submitted by the Count Agent or supervising Ag Teacher. Entries turned in by individuals will not be accepted.
- **21.** All Ag Teachers and County Extension Agent are responsible for their exhibitors conduct and dress throughout the fair.
- **22. Animals MAY NOT be decorated** for the sale. They **must** go through the sale ring in the same state as they were shown.
- 23. An exhibitor can only sell two lots on sale night. It can be any combination of species/division but not two animals from the same species/division. The exception to this rule is an exhibitor may sell two replacement females but nothing else.

Market Steer Division

Superintendent, Kenny Roberts

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. Tag-in will be according to State Validation Guidelines and must be done by the last day of June.
- 3. Steers will be broken into 3 divisions (American, British, and Exotic) by a third-party classifier and then broken into weight classes by the superintendent between the three divisions.
- 4. Show is a "blow and go" show. This means cattle may be washed and blown dry, but no glues or other adhesives will be used.
- 5. Maximum weight for steers is 1200 pounds. Steers weighing more than 1200 pounds will not be allowed to show.
- 6. Showmanship exhibitors must be entered in the market steer show.
- 7. Mini Hereford steers are not eligible for the premium sale.
- 8. Sale order will be selected by the judge following champion and reserve champion selection. The champion and reserve champion will be sale lots one and two respectively and the judge will select the top 25% for the sale along with two alternates.

Breeding Beef Cattle Division

Superintendent, Phillip Burnett

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. Heifers will show in a standard TJLA breed format. Breeds will be split into American, British, and Continental Divisions. Breed champions will compete for divisions, the three division winners will compete for overall champion heifer.
- 3. One (1) head makes a breed.
- 4. Exhibitors must present original registration papers. **No** faxes, phone calls, letters from breed associations, or bill of sale will be accepted.
- 5. Show is a "blow and go" show. This means cattle may be washed and blown dry but no glues or other adhesives will be used.
- 6. Papers will be sent in along with the heifer's entry form. Papers can be turned in up until Thursday of the show week but a 20 dollar late fee will be assessed.
- 7. Two showmanship classes will be held in the heifer division.
- 8. Heifers will be divided by age in the following classes:
 - o April 1, 2023 and after
 - o January 1, 2023 March 31, 2023
 - o September 1, 2022 December 31, 2022
 - o May 1, 2022- August 31, 2022
 - o January 1, 2022 April 30, 2022
 - o September 1, 2021 -December 31, 2021
 - o May 1, 2021 August 31, 2021
- 9. Showmanship exhibitors must be entered in the breeding heifer show.

Swine Division

Superintendent, Coby Cook

Breeding

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. No boars will be shown.
- 3. There will be two (2) gilt classes with all breeds showing together broken by weight.
- 4. Gilts shown in the breeding show WILL NOT be eligible for the market show.
- 5. Touch up clipping of swine is allowed.
- 6. Showmanship exhibitors must be entered in the breeding or market swine show.

Market

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. No boars will be shown.
- 3. Superintendent will be responsible for weighing all swine. Swine must weigh no less than 200 pounds and no more than 280 pounds. There will be zero tolerance from these weights.
- 4. No foreign material is to be allowed on swine when going through weigh in.
- 5. All breeds will be shown together in classes broken by the superintendent according to weight.
- 6. Any gilt not making weight requirements will be eligible to transfer into breeding swine classes.
- 7. Touch up clipping of swine is allowed.
- 8. Showmanship exhibitors must be entered in the breeding or market swine show and show a pig tagged in their name in showmanship.
- 9. Sale order will be selected by the judge following champion and reserve champion selection. The champion and reserve champion will be sale lots one and two respectively and the judge will select the top 25% for the sale along with two alternates.

Sheep Division

Breeding

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. All sheep must be shorn to breed standards.
- 3. Sheep classes will be broken into classes by weight by the sheep superintendent.
- 4. Showmanship exhibitors must be entered in the breeding or market sheep show.

Market

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. All sheep must be slick shorn leaving uniform length of wool over the entire body.
- 3. No intact males (ram lambs) will be shown.
- 4. Classes will be broken according to weight by the superintendent with all breeds being shown together.
- 5. Showmanship exhibitors must be entered in the breeding or market sheep show.
- 6. Sale order will be selected by the judge following champion and reserve champion selection. The champion and reserve champion will be sale lots one and two respectively and the judge will select the top 25% for the sale along with two alternates.

Dairy Goat Division

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. Breeds to be shown: Alpine, LaMancha, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, Toggenburg and all mixed breeds including pygmy goats are not required to be registered.
- 3. All animals must be disbudded or dehorned.
- 4. Exhibitors must wear all white clothing (no t-shirts, no shorts, and no sandals).
- 5. Animals are not required to be body clipped.
- 6. Age of animal on show date will determine class.
- 7. Classes will be divided into two (2) divisions:
 - a. Junior Does-less than 24 months of age that have never freshened (given birth)
 - b. Senior Does- 24 months of age or older that have freshened (given birth). This includes dry milkers. Any doe 24 months of age or older that have never freshened (given birth) shall not be shown.
- 8. There will not be a pre-show milk out (senior does will be shown with full udders).
- 9. Classes will be divided by breed and age after the entry deadline. Some breeds may be combined at the discretion of the show superintendent due to the number of entries.
- 10. Health papers are not required but an animal showing signs of illness (example: abscess, pink eye) shall be removed from the fairgrounds at the discretion of the superintendent.
- 11. No bucks will be allowed at the show.
- 12. Showmanship exhibitors must be entered in the dairy goat show.

Breeding Meat Goat Division

Superintendent, Janice Young

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. Breeds to be shown: Boer, Kiko, Spanish, Pygmy, and Crossbred Goats are not required to be registered.
- 3. Animals with natural horns are allowed.
- 4. Animals are not required to be body clipped.
- 5. Goats will be broken into classes by weight by the superintendent.
- 6. Health papers are not required but animals showing signs of illness (example: abscess, pink eye) shall be removed from the fairgrounds at the discretion of the show superintendent.
- 7. No bucks will be allowed at the show.
- 8. Showmanship exhibitors must be entered in the breeding meat goat show.

Market Goat Division

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. Market kids of either sex are eligible. No intact males.
- 3. Goat show is a Blow and Go show
- 4. Animals must have a minimum weight of 30 pounds; there is no top weight limit.
- 5. Exhibitors are allowed the use of halter or collar in the show ring.
- 6. Market goats must be slick shorn to 3/8 inch or less.
- 7. Classes will be broken by the superintendent according to weight.
- 8. Goats are not required to be dehorned.
- 9. Showmanship exhibitors must be entered in the market goat show.
- 10. Sale order will be selected by the judge following champion and reserve champion selection. The champion and reserve champion will be sale lots one and two respectively and the judge will select the top 25% for the sale along with two alternates.

Breeding Fowl Division

Superintendent, Craig Rounsaville

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. Exhibitor is responsible for all feeding and watering during the show. Due to the heat/sun, **WATER** will **ALWAYS** need to be in place. Please provide water containers that will tie to the cage, so they do not spill.
- 3. Breeding fowl cannot arrive without a copy of proof of **Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days** of date of show. The original copy of the test results may be kept by the exhibitor to use at future shows (as they are valid for a year) but a copy MUST be provided to the show superintendent prior to any fowl being placed in pens.
- 4. Due to the past confusion of **SUBSTITUTIONS OF FOWL**, the superintendent requires that each exhibitor contact show personnel, provide test results and indicate if the exhibitor is substituting any birds **BEFORE** birds are placed into pens.
- 5. **BREEDING CHICKENS MUST BE tested to show.** Contact Zeb Tindel to get on the list. A copy can be sent with your Fannin County Junior Livestock Show Breeding Fowl Show Entry paperwork. Testing may be performed at the showground if the tester is available.
- 6. NO BIRDS ARE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE BARN AREA WITHOUT THIS TEST, NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 7. There is NO LIMIT to the number of entries a single exhibitor may enter.
- 8. Exhibitor MUST advise on entry form the correct age, breed, and variety of the fowl:
 - a. Divisions: Large Fowl Bantam Fowl b. Sexes and Age divided as follows:
 - i. Cocks- males over 1 year
 - ii. Cockerels- males under 1 year
 - iii. Hens- females over 1 year
 - iv. Pullets- females under 1 year
- 10. Production pens will consist of three females of the same breed and variety, any age (large fowl only) matching in size, color and laying characteristics and entry fee will be \$10.00/pen
- 11. Trio pens will consist of 1 male and 2 females of the same breed and variety and the entry fee will be \$10.00/pen.
 - a Exhibitor must designate young/old and large/bantam group:
 - i. Trio pens may be shown as a young trio (all birds under 1 year of age)
 - ii. Trio pens may be shown as an old trio (all birds over 1 year of age)
- 12. Exhibitors must use the Fannin County Junior Livestock Show Breeding Fowl entry form.
- 13. Judging will be done according to the Standard of Perfection for each breed.
- 14. No late entries for breeding fowl.

Broiler Division

Superintendent, Craig Rounsaville

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. Entry fee will be due on the regular entry deadline in September. The entry fee will be \$25.00.
- 3. Exhibitor is responsible for all feeding and watering during the show. Due to the heat/sun **WATER** will **ALWAYS** need to be in place.
- 4. Broilers will be provided from an independent source. Only these birds provided by the junior livestock show will be eligible for this show. There is no testing needed for broiler birds due to the test being performed at time of hatching.
- 5. Each exhibitor will receive 25 one to three-day old chicks to feed as their project. Each exhibitor will pay a set amount for the chicks.
- 6. Entry will be determined by availability of chicks. If delivery is short of any chicks, this shortage will be divided among all exhibitors.
- 7. A pen of birds on show day will consist of 3 birds of either sex.
- 8. Wing bands will be checked during sale order selection. If the exhibitor does not have the correct wing band that was assigned to them at pick up they will be disqualified. If a bird is missing a wing band the entire pen will be disqualified. There will be no sharing of birds.
- 9. No substitutions (or switching) of birds is allowed once they are placed into the pen.
 - a. Exhibitor must bring only the number of birds allowed (3 total). Extra birds MAY NOT be placed under the tables in boxes or other crates.
 - b. Each exhibitor will be responsible for their own holders for the show.
 - c. Only exhibitors/holders will be allowed in show area during judging.
- 10. Chicks are ordered the first week of July. They normally arrive around August 20-25. Your ag teacher/extension agent will be contacted.

Breeding Rabbit Division

Superintendent, Kasey Naylor

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. Exhibitor is responsible for feeding and watering during the show. Due to the heat/sun, **WATER** will **ALWAYS** need to be in place.
- 3. Breeding rabbits showing signs of sickness will not be allowed.
- 4. There is NO LIMIT to the number of entries a single exhibitor may enter.
- 5. Exhibitors MUST advise on entry form the correct age, breed, and variety of rabbit.
 - a Sex of rabbit will be broken into:
 - i. Bucks (male)
 - ii. Does (female)
 - b Variety will be broken into:
 - i. Solid (solid one color or set pattern)
 - ii. Broken (a two-color pattern)
 - c Age of the rabbit will be broken into:
 - i. Junior (months of age or younger, both large and small bleeds)
 - ii. Intermediate (6-8 months, LARGE breeds only)
 - iii. Senior (6 months of age or older in small breeds, 8 months or older in large breeds)
 - 7. Entry fee will be \$5.00 per single entry (one rabbit).
 - 8. There will be a one-time \$5.00 office charge for the breeding rabbit show per exhibitor.
 - 9. Exhibitors must use the 2022 Fannin County Junior Livestock Show Breeding Rabbit Entry Form.
 - 10. Judging will be done according to the Standard of Perfection for each breed per ARBA rules. (No pet class, however, a pedigree is not necessary).
 - 11. Each breeding rabbit must have a permanent tattoo in the LEFT ear per ARBA rules.
 - 12. All breeding rabbits must be at the Fryer pen validation, during the week of September 7th, to make sure they are tattooed and properly classified in their breed and color.

Fryer Division

Superintendent, Kasey Naylor

- 1. All general rules and regulations apply.
- 2. Exhibitor is responsible for all feeding and watering during the show. Due to the heat/sun **WATER** will **ALWAYS** need to be in place.
- 3. Fryer pens will consist of three (3) rabbits of the same breed and variety.
- 4. No rabbit can weigh more than 5.5 pounds.
- 5. Exhibitors must have owned and had possession of the rabbits since validation.
- 6. Validation will be done by the superintendent in September.
- 7. All fryers must have a county validation tattoo in the RIGHT ear to be eligible for the show.
- 8. Exhibitors will be allowed to validate more than three (3) rabbits for each pen.
- 9. Exhibitors will be allowed to bring more than three (3) rabbits to a place in the pen, to be narrowed down to three (3) before the fryer show begins.
- 10. Exhibitors will be allowed to enter more than one pen.
- 11. Fryer pens showing signs of sickness will not be allowed.
- 12. Entry fee will be \$25.00 per fryer pen. Entries will be submitted on the regular entry date in September
- 13. Fryer pens will have all three (3) rabbits placed into the same pen on the judging table, prior to judging. Tattoos will be checked to validate proper rabbits are used for the exhibitor's pen.
- 14. Judging will be done according to the Standard of Perfection for each breed per ARBA rules.
- 15. Sale order will be selected by the judge following champion and reserve champion selection. The champion and reserve champion will be sale lots one and two respectively and the judge will select the top 25% for the sale along with two alternates.

Rules and Regulations

1. All rules will be enforced and all dates provided are MANDATORY.

- 2. The FCJLA reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and requirements as published on this set of General Rules and to reasonably settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected to the show and the right to amend or add to these rules as it's judgment may determine. Any exhibitor who violates these rules may forfeit all fees paid, privileges, or awards.
- 3. The FCJLA shall not be liable for injuries or accidents that may occur during the events held for the show and sale. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any such loss, injury or damage, whether to person or property, and shall indemnity the FCJLA for any one of its members or volunteers against all legal proceedings arising there from.
- 4. Exhibitors must be an activity 4-H or FFA member from Fannin County in grades 3-12. Exhibitors must be eight years of age or entering third grader prior to September 1, 2023.
- 5. Commercial Heifers must be owned under continuous care of the exhibitor by June 30th.
- 6. Each exhibitor is limited to two heifers in the Replacement Heifer Show.
- 7. All vaccinations are the responsibility of the exhibitor. All records must be kept in the record book provided by the FCJLA.
- 8. To be listed as bred on the sale sheet exhibitors must have proof of breeding this includes Vet Palpation or Blood Test.
- 9. All heifers must be dehorned or naturally polled.
- 10. If a heifer loses its ear tag the exhibitor must notify their Ag Teacher or 4-H Advisor, and the commercial heifer chairman immediately. The animal must be tagged to show and the old tag turned in.
- 11. Replacement heifers can be shown at other local shows prior to the Fannin County Replacement Show and Sale.
- 12. Heifers will be broken into classes by weight by the show superintendents.
- 13. No grooming materials are allowed. This is a "Blow and Go" Show. All heifers will be shown with hair and in a natural state WITHOUT the use of glues, adhesives, paints, etc. Heifers with any of glue, paint, adhesive, etc. in the hair will be disqualified and premiums forfeited. Heifers will be toweled.
- 14. The judge will select sale order immediately following the Replacement Heifer show. 75% of the heifers that arrive will be eligible for the Replacement Heifer Sale.
- 15. The heifers entered in the replacement show are limited to only the replacement heifer division. (Example: Registered cattle are prohibited from showing in the Replacement Heifer Division)

- 16. During weigh in at the Fannin County Fair, a 3rd party sifter will be on hand to evaluate heifer temperament. If the sifter deems the heifer is too unruly to show, the heifer will be disqualified. There will be no protest and the sifter's decision is final.
- 17. All halter heifers must be broken prior to exhibiting at the Fair. During the show and sale order, if a heifer proves to be too unruly for the exhibitor to handle, the heifer will be disqualified.
- 18. The FCJLA shall not be liable to the exhibitor for lost profit or financial loss (indirectly or directly).
- 19. Protests: All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$200, cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if the protest is NOT sustained. Protests must state plainly the cause of the complaint and must be hand delivered to the FCJLA within 24 hours of the occasion. Judges and sifters decisions on placing and rulings are NOT acceptable for protests.
- 20. Buckles will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion Replacement Heifer.
- 21. Buckles will also be awarded to the Champion Junior and Champion Senior Herdsman.
- 22. Herdsmen awards will be calculated by a combination of record book (50%), and show placing (50%).
- 23. All heifers will be charged a \$50.00 commission to sell.
- 24. Record books must be kept in the official Fannin County Replacement Heifer Record Book only.
- 25. Record books MUST be turned in by the stated deadline.
- 26. Sale order will be selected by the judge following champion and reserve champion selection. The champion and reserve champion will be sale lots one and two respectively and the judge will select the top 75% for the sale along with two alternates.
